

ClassDojo Technology Workshop Lesson Plan

Overview & Purpose

This one-hour technology workshop is to introduce teachers and staff to an online behavioral management system called ClassDojo. ClassDojo is a free online behavioral management system that can be linked to PBIS for teachers use to track student behaviors and skills they are working on such as respectfulness, working together, being kind, etc. However, with this online tool, teachers provide students with immediate feedback on their skills progress and much more. Parents can join ClassDojo with an access code to keep track of their child's behavior and development in class daily.

The purpose of me presenting this ClassDojo website is to introduce, explain, and help teachers and staff create a ClassDojo account. My principal has expressed that all teachers use ClassDojo in their classrooms school-wide beginning next semester and ongoing to be on the same consensus with acknowledging and tracking expected positive behaviors that correlate with PBIS and other skills for individual students to show improvement.

Educators facilitate learning with technology to support student achievement of the ISTE Standards for Students. Educators:

- □ **6b.** Manage the use of technology and student learning strategies in digital platforms, virtual environments, hands-on makerspaces or in the field.
